

European Commission calls for more entrepreneurship education

According to the European Commission, entrepreneurship education helps significantly boost the number of pupils that will then go on to start their own company (up to 20% of participants).

The investment in entrepreneurship education brings high returns as pupils go on to found their own businesses, investing in Europe's markets and labour force. As three-quarters of Europeans have not participated in such a course, however, the Commission is encouraging others to expand the entrepreneurship projects to as many students across Europe as possible. Even if they do not go on to create new businesses, young people will find their CVs markedly enhanced thanks to the training.
